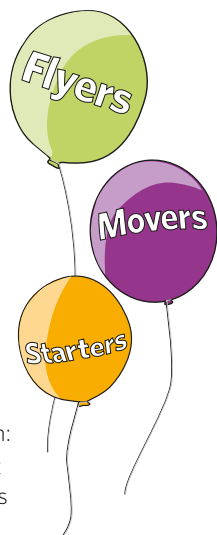

Why offer Cambridge English: Young Learners?

Three fun, activity-based tests

- Three levels – *Starters*, *Movers* and *Flyers* – so children have a clear route for progression.
- Quick to take so not intimidating:
 - E.g. *Starters* Listening (20 mins), Reading & Writing (20 mins), Speaking (3–5 mins).
- Specially designed for 7–12 year-olds to increase their motivation to learn English:
 - Familiar and interesting topics make it easier for children to relate to the tests and talk about them with confidence.
 - Appealing content and activities, such as drawing, colouring and conversation, make the tests fun and enjoyable.



International English

- Developed according to international standards.

A Cambridge English award for everyone

Every child who takes a *Cambridge English: Young Learners* test gets a Cambridge English award. This is a huge achievement and rewards a child's individual ability.

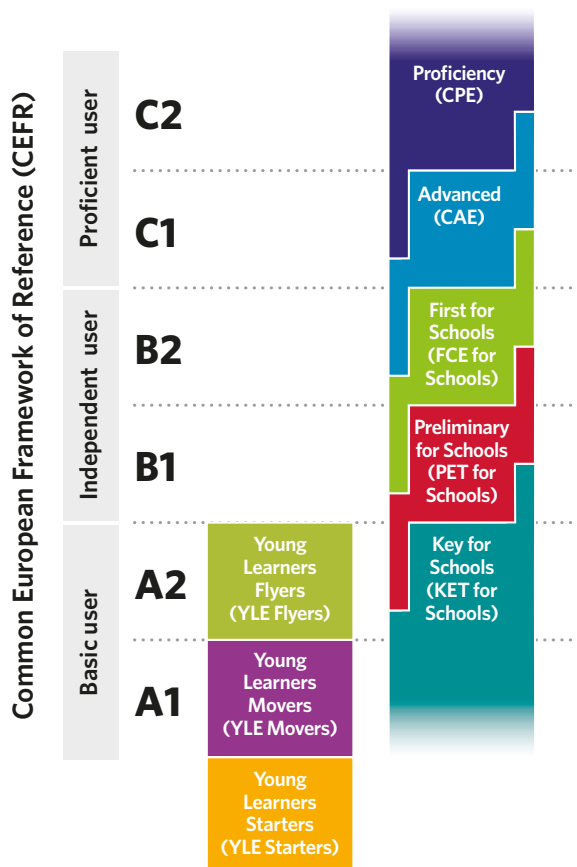
